Golden sun moths are small dark coloured moths that fly during the day, like a butterfly. They are only found in native grasslands and fly between November and January. They were discovered at Carboor in 2009, then Wangaratta in 2021.

Come along and learn about NE Victoria's special invertebrate, how to see them, monitor them, and how to manage their grassland homes!
